

Waterloo, Iowa, September 19, 2023

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Black Hawk, in the State of Iowa, met in regular adjourned meeting at the Courthouse in Waterloo, County Seat of said County, and electronically via Zoom, at nine o'clock (9:00) a.m., pursuant to law, to the rules of said Board, and to adjournment. The meeting was called to order and on roll call there were present: Tom Little, Chris Schwartz, Dan Trelka and Linda Laylin, Chair.

Absent: Tavis Hall.

Unless otherwise noted, all actions were approved unanimously, Hall absent.

Moved by Trelka, seconded by Schwartz that the AGENDA be received and placed on file with the County Auditor as approved. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS. Gilbertville Mayor Mark Thome and Mayor Pro tem Scott Becker thanked the Board for its willingness to assist with the Gilbertville Emergency Services Building. They had received bids the previous evening and now estimate that they may have a shortfall of \$197,000. The Board had promised \$200,000 in ARPA funds for the project if needed. (See minutes of September 12.) Thome and Becker said that if needed, the county's money would be the last used.

Schwartz moved the following resolution seconded by Trelka.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the LOWEST REASONABLE BID received from Bruening Rock Products, Inc. of Decorah, IA, for the completion of the identified work associated with paving along Division I of the Cedar Valley Nature Trail project (unpaved portion of the trail) which consists of pipe culvert, revetment, and intake installation, asphalt paving of a 10' wide trail, installation of concrete trail and ADA detectable warnings at roadway crossings, earth shoulder construction, paving of granular road crossings in the amount of \$1,831,919.31 and utilizing Destination Iowa Grant Funds and American Rescue Plan funding for the purpose of meeting the increased usage needs be accepted and contract awarded. The same has been approved by the Conservation Board and recommended for approval by the Board of Supervisors and to be funded by Destination Iowa Grant funds and American Rescue Plan funds.

Conservation Director Mike Hendrickson said he was thrilled with the bids, as the estimate was \$2.25 million.

Little moved the following resolution seconded by Schwartz.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED to accept and approve contract amendment #6 for the Professional Services Contract with Origin Design of Dubuque, IA, for the Cedar Valley Nature Trail, Division I, Paving project, for Black Hawk County and utilizing Destination Iowa Grant and American Rescue Plan funds for Construction Services to include construction administration, construction staking, and construction observation for this phase of the project. Contract amendment #6 for Construction Services for this phase of the project is a Not to Exceed contract in the amount of \$235,000.00 for said services. The same has been approved by the Conservation Board and recommended for approval by the Board of Supervisors and to be funded with American Rescue Plan funds.

Hendrickson said the plan is to complete this work in the winter so paving can begin in the spring of 2024.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the LOWEST REASONABLE BID received from P&K Midwest, Waterloo, Iowa (bid opening September 12, 2023, 9:09 a.m.) for the purchase of one (1) John Deere 6110M Cab Tractor with a Diamond 22-foot boom mower attachment for FY2024 for the Black Hawk County Secondary Roads Department with a bid of \$209,015.22 be approved as recommended by Catherine Nicholas, County Engineer.

Nicholas said the low bid was 20% higher than the budgeted amount, so she will pause truck purchases until she can get a clearer picture of what is available in the budget. Little asked if the replaced 1994 tractor will be retired. Nicholas said it will be.

Moved by Schwartz, seconded by Trelka to approve the updated ICAP Member Proxy form listing Michelle Weidner and Lori Wermers as member liaisons and direct the Chair to sign for same. Motion carried.

At Nine-twenty-five o'clock (9:25) a.m., a public hearing was held as provided by law in Board Room 201 of the Black Hawk County Courthouse, 316 E. 5th Street, Waterloo, Iowa at which time all interested persons could appear to file objections on the proposed health care services for the Black Hawk County Jail.

Moved by Schwartz, seconded by Trelka to close the hearing after oral/written comments are received. Motion carried.

At nine-twenty-five (9:25) a.m. the Chair announced the time had arrived in accordance with prior action, for the receiving and opening of bids for the proposed health care services for the Black Hawk County Jail.

The Chair announced the following sealed bids were all received by five o'clock (5:00) p.m. Friday, September 8, 2023, as stated in the Notice to Bidders. The time of announcement being nine-twenty-five (9:25) a.m., the following bids were opened and read:

Moved by Schwartz, seconded by Trelka that the Board of Supervisors receive and place on file the bids for the proposed health care services for the Jail to allow time to review said bids as recommended by Nate Neff, Jail Administrator.

Neff said that the committee will meet on September 25. The Board agreed that its recommendation should go on the agenda for October 3. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION – ARPA funds status and general reserves commitments. Finance Director Michelle Weidner said that of the \$25,489,501 allocated to the county, all but \$2,534,380.27 has been assigned to different projects (including the \$10 million in replacement revenue, which can be used for unrestricted projects). She said many of the amounts for projects yet to start are general estimates, but she also assumes that if there is truly \$2.5 million yet available that it will be largely taken up by cost overruns, based on recent experience. She described the progress of various projects and the basis for their cost estimates. The largest project awaiting review and/or approval is the Public Health Department Space Development, with a placeholder estimate of \$5,861,739. Laylin said the status of the Public Health project will be known soon. The supervisors discussed how they think that other cities in the county will expect to get assistance in projects the way the county assisted Gilbertville with its emergency services building. Little said that the Sheriff's evidence facility would be back on the Board agenda on September 26.

Weidner discussed the county's general fund reserves. She said the general fund unassigned fund balance at the end of fiscal year 2023 is estimated at \$27,456,115, or 69% of general fund budgeted expenditures. With budgeted uses of reserves in FY24 (including a \$1,200,000 employee turnover factor) she estimated the fund balance at the end of FY24 to be reduced to 52% of expenditures. The supervisors discussed means of lowering balances and what level is ideal.

ANY REPORTS OR INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD. Trelka wondered if the county should hire the contractor that the city of Waterloo uses for parking enforcement for the courthouse parking lot. Facilities Director Rory Geving said he would like to make policy changes to the county's parking ordinance before considering that option and noted that while courthouse security has been undergoing a lot of turnovers, officers have recently restarted enforcing the ordinance. He said that unfortunately some of the abuse has come from employees using the lot who don't have proper parking passes.

Schwartz said that Hartman Reserve has its fall native plant sale on September 20. He said the Board should be proud for resisting efforts to put a bitcoin data mining operation in the county, noting that the city of West Des Moines is struggling with its water supply after allowing a Google facility to be built which needs large amounts of water in its cooling tower.

At ten-forty-six o'clock (10:46) a.m., the Board of Supervisors of Black Hawk County, Iowa, sitting as a Board of Canvassers proceeded to CANVASS the returns of the Waterloo School special PPEL election held on Tuesday, September 12, 2023, in accordance with the *Code of Iowa* §50.24.

In accordance with §50.22 of the *Code of Iowa*, the Commissioner announced there was 1 provisional ballot rejected and not counted.
