Transitional housing project by Tom Eachus, Cedar Valley Housing Corporation. Laylin said that Board members are planning to consider affordable housing as a use for American Rescue Plan Act funds, and so she asked Eachus, the Executive Director at UnityPoint Health Black Hawk Grundy Mental Health Center, to discuss the CV Housing Corporation's plan. Eachus said a major problem that leads to people with mental health diagnoses cycling through law enforcement situations multiple times is the lack of stable housing, so CVHC has a plan to provide transitional or permanent housing that will save the community money in the long run. He shared the Board the plan's preliminary budget of \$7,414,880, allowing for inflation.

RECEIVE PROJECT UPDATES FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS/ELECTED OFFICIALS. Human Resources Director Amanda Fesenmeyer said the Employee Cookout at Hickory Hills Park took place the day before, and she thanked the many people who made it a success. She introduced the committee members, who posed for a picture with the supervisors. She said she would like the Board to consider supporting future events that show appreciation to county staff.

County Engineer Cathy Nicholas invited the supervisors to the annual fall safety meeting on October 7.

Schwartz moved the following resolution seconded by Laylin.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED to proclaim the second week in October as Earth Science Week.

Sherman Lundy of BMC Aggregates described the Sunday at the Quarry event to be held at the Raymond Quarry, 6900 Dubuque Road from 10am to 4pm on October 2.

Moved by Little, seconded by Schwartz to receive and place on file the ACTUARIAL OPINION CERTIFICATE for FY22 of the Black Hawk County Insurance Health Care Plan as submitted by Insurance Strategies Consulting, LLC and to issue payment for a \$100 filing fee, plus service charges, and \$975 for the 509A Study for plan ending June 30, 2022. Motion carried.

Discussion – Burning within Black Hawk County. Mike Devine of Cedar Falls described an incident in which smoke from a business adjacent to the Cedar Falls city limits was covering his neighborhood, and he was told that nothing could be done because it was outside city limits, despite the poisonous attributes of smoke. He researched the subject and found that Iowa Administrative Code prohibits burning within ¼ mile of inhabited buildings unless the weather is favorable. He asked that the county pass a policy like the one in Polk County that prohibits open burning of certain substances so that the county could enforce it. Schwartz said the Polk County policy is through the Board of Health, and since that carries more weight Mr. Devine should approach the Black Hawk County Board of Health. Conservation Director Mike Hendrickson said that he could connect Mr. Devine to the Department of Natural Resources environmental protection office in Manchester. County Engineer Cathy Nicholas said that it is common for farmers to control noxious weeds through burning, so that should be considered in taking up a policy.

Discussion – Naphcare Contract Amendment. Sheriff Tony Thompson said that after presenting Naphcare's request to renegotiate its contract for providing health services at the county jail two years into its five-year term, at an increase of about 37.8%, he researched the situation by talking to the county's insurance adviser, to area hospital executives, and to other sheriff's offices in Iowa and found that Naphcare's claims of increased costs were legitimate. He worked out a new proposal with Naphcare to lower the increase to 26% and spread it over a five-year period. A large part of the increase is due to new staff, with Naphcare recommending round-the-clock staffing by registered nurses, who are qualified and authorized to provide services that licensed practical nurses are not.

Naphcare's chief executive officer, Brad McLane explained the rising costs that Naphcare has been absorbing, operating at a loss in order to provide the level of care they feel is necessary, though it exceeds required levels. He said that he has been talking to clients around the country to explain the market forces that are driving their increased costs. White said that the increases must be paid by taxpayers, who don't get the guaranteed care that jail inmates get. McLane said he didn't know why people out of jail don't have the same constitutionally protected right to get health care that people in jail have, but he feels that providing health care in jail makes the community healthier when inmates leave jail. Laylin asked if the county could have more time to decide than the proposed amendment date of October 1, and if this was his best offer. McLane said he could wait longer, particularly if the county decided to formulate a request for proposal (RFP), and that he is always willing to negotiate.

Jail Administrator Captain Nathan Neff said that having nurses 24/7 is a huge benefit in life-and-death situations involving illnesses and suicide attempts, and while this is a humanitarian reason, the county also has potentially saved millions of dollars from lawsuits that arise from deaths in the jail. He said if the Board decides to issue an RFP that it would be long and complex, and while he could prepare one, the county would be better served by hiring a consultant at a cost of \$100,000-150,000 to make sure the multi-million-dollar contract is done right. He suggested that an amendment be signed through the end of the fiscal year to allow the necessary time to do an RFP properly.

Social workers Sara Geiger and Jessica Roush said they work with chronically mentally ill patients and they find Naphcare to be a vital part of promptly and effectively tending to mentally ill inmates, making sure their necessary medications are continued (which didn't happen before Naphcare got involved) and lessening the chances that a mentally ill inmate will return to jail.

Trelka said mental health is important, but the supervisors must consider other county departments, and he asked what they would be willing to give up. He supported issuing an RFP. Little said that the issues raised about Naphcare were good points, but the Board has to figure out how to pay for everything. The county has good reserves, but they won't be there forever.

James Robinson said that the county could have saved money if he had not been misdiagnosed with mental illness.

ANY REPORTS OR INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD. Laylin asked Assistant County Attorney and ARP Committee Chair Mike Treinen if he had an ARP update. Treinen said he was busy with trial preparation but that he and another committee member would talk with Tom Kaleko of Baker Tilly next week.

White said tomorrow would be the 26<sup>th</sup> Honor Flight to leave from Waterloo and he asked people to see off or welcome back the 92 veterans going to Washington.

## ELECTION CANVASS

At ten-thirty-two o'clock (10:32) a.m., the Board of Supervisors of Black Hawk County, Iowa, sitting as a Board of Canvassers proceeded to CANVASS the returns of the Special Waterloo City and Hudson School District Elections held Tuesday, September 13, 2022 in accordance with the *Iowa Code* §50.24.

In accordance with §50.22 of the *Code of Iowa*, the Commissioner announced there was 1 provisional ballot rejected and not counted.

Trelka moved the following resolution seconded by Schwartz.
