UPDATES-Ben Delagardelle d/b/a Urban Services, Inc. gave his monthly Washburn Sanitary Sewer System update. He said the system's permit, which expires in a week, can't be renewed immediately because the Department of Natural Resources is on administrative delay, but it's usually a formality. Service calls were below average with 13 the first half of the year but there have been 24 since then, which he thinks is just due to the ebb and flow of different species of pumps. Finance Director Michelle Weidner asked how the ARPA projects were going. Delagardelle said 14 have been completed and he hopes to have 30-35 done this year and begin again in the spring.

Brennan said there was only one bid, and the bidder changed some of the specifications, resulting in an amount that is a couple thousand dollars different from the original bid. He said there will be a separate bid letting later this year for the truck beds and snow equipment.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED to approve the Sheriff's Office's proposed Stanley Jail Security System upgrades project using ARPA funding.

Information Technology Director Al Yu said the upgrades involve three projects with a total cost just under \$400,000.

NAYS: None. Resolution adopted.

Moved by Trelka, seconded by Schwartz to submit the proposed purchase of Wall-Mounted Workstations for the Public Health Clinic to Baker Tilly for ARPA eligibility evaluation.

Public Health Director Kaitlin Emrich said that the work stations are pretty universal and if installed now can be used in a different location later. Motion carried.

Discussion/Possible Board Action - to discuss the Sheriff's Officer's Evidence Processing and Storage Facility. Little said that he put the item on the agenda so the Board will vote one way or another and the Sheriff's Office can plan for the future. He moved to approve building a Sheriff's Officer's Evidence Processing and Storage Facility at the Sheriff's Range Training Facility.

Trelka said that he had talked to Waterloo Police Chief Joe Leibold, who said he wanted to pursue a joint facility, and Waterloo Councilmember Dave Boesen, who identified a number of buildings in the downtown area that might be used, and County Attorney Brian Williams, who indicated that he would like his staff to have close access to such a facility. Sheriff Tony Thompson said he is willing to work with Waterloo and Cedar Falls, and he has always expected that a new facility would be used by all three agencies, but he has been providing information for two years and he and his staff are ready for action now however the Board decides. Hall said he supports building a facility at the range but he is open to discussing options with other partners. Little said that he believes the Board needs to act when it has been informed that the county is exposed to liability. Schwartz said the Board has received contradictory messages from potential partners and it would be good to have all entities in the same room at the same time. He wants to do something but he wants to see what the possibilities really are. Thompson said building new would avoid the problems of refitting an existing building in such a specialized way. He reminded Schwartz that Schwartz had asked him if the plan for the facility, which was scaled back 25% to reduce the \$2 million price tag, would fit the county's needs in 10 years, and he told him it would not, but that the original plan would. Schwartz said the Board should be thinking 10-15 years in the future, recalling that a half-measure in removing debris under the jail parking lot several years ago resulted in a costlier comprehensive cleanup later. Laylin said she was encouraged by the positive responses from the cities and would like to at least consider their input. Trelka said that he will attend council meetings in Cedar Falls and Waterloo to raise the question to them generally and would also discuss it with Williams. Schwartz said that the county should consider bonding for the cost, having been reminded by Johnson County officials at last week's CCC Oversight Board meeting that county debt service tax levies, unlike general fund levies, receive tax dollars from tax increment financing districts. Laylin asked Trelka to report back to the Board so the Board may act quickly. Little's motion died for lack of a second.

Discussion on the Community Services Funding Applications. Laylin said 22 applications were submitted by the September 30 deadline, that \$100,000 is budgeted and \$700,000 has been requested. She asked how the supervisors wanted to handle the applications. Little said some requests are ridiculous, with one receiving tax dollars through a referendum and another already receiving monthly payments from the county through a contract. Schwartz said he would like to see presentations to help him judge accountability, and they could either have presentations from those organizations that a supervisor wants to hear or they could have them from all applicants. Hall thought the Board was considering using unspent budget funds for the requests. Little said that organizations receiving funding should give the Board quarterly updates on their use of county funds. Schwartz said the awards should not be limited to \$100,000. Trelka agreed for this particular ask. The supervisors agreed to hear all 22 applications and to schedule meetings on Tuesdays and Thursdays as soon as practical.

CLOSED SESSION

Trelka moved the following resolution seconded by Hall.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that pursuant to the provisions of the Iowa Open Meetings Law, by the Authority of the Code of Iowa, Chapter 21.5(1)(i), the Black Hawk County Board of Supervisors shall proceed into closed session for the purpose to discuss the professional competency of individual whose appointment, hiring or performance is being considered when necessary to prevent needless and irreparable injury to that individual's reputation and the individual requests a closed session.

The Board of Supervisors met in closed session at 9:55 am.

Moved by Schwartz seconded by to adjourn the Board of Supervisors meeting in CLOSED SESSION at 10:30 am. Motion carried.

ANY REPORTS OR INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD. Hall said that the Board, county staff and the public will be invited over the next two weeks to participate in the county's rebrand survey.
