

SOLID WASTE FUNDS ALLOCATION BOARD

POLICY/SCOPE

It is the policy of Black Hawk County to consider requests for funding from non-profit (501)(C)(3) agencies/organizations whose services are intended to benefit all residents of the County.

For as long as the Solid Waste Management Commission voluntarily donates funds to Black Hawk County, the funds received shall be set aside in the County's General Fund for the purpose of funding requests from non-profit 501(c)(3) agencies/organizations.

PROCEDURES/REQUIREMENTS

A Solid Waste Funds Allocation Board consisting of five (5) Black Hawk County citizens shall make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors for the agencies' fiscal year funding. The allocation board members shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors to four-year staggered terms effective with the adoption of this policy. Members may serve no more than two consecutive four-year terms.

For the terms following the enactment of this policy, members shall be selected as follows: Two members will serve from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2009. Three board members will serve from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2011.

Non-profit agencies/organizations that apply for funding will complete the Black Hawk County Funding Application (see attached).

The Solid Waste Funds Allocation Board will use the evaluation process adopted by the Board of Supervisors (see attached). If an appointee to the Board is affiliated with a non-profit organization that applies for funding, that member must abstain from voting on the recommendation.

Applications will be reviewed and evaluated by the Solid Waste Funds Allocation Board with its recommendation submitted to the Board of Supervisors no later than January 15 of each year for the following fiscal year funding.

Final decisions on funding will be determined by the Board of Supervisors.
